Hamlet Court Road Public Survey – Spring 2023

Summary Comment

The survey attracted 126 respondents which although generally disappointing for the extent of the survey publicity (MS newsletter, Facebook, HCRiH event) does represent a good number of opinions from which useful conclusions can be drawn. Many of the respondents (91.8%) indicated use of Facebook which is likely to have prompted most of the responses.

The road as exists was given an average mark of 51 (range 14-90), a mid-range mark indicating both some good levels of support but also criticism, which does fit with anecdotal comments received over time and the rest of the survey.

Respondents indicated good levels of use of the existing road (84% occasional to frequent use, 40% regular use). These levels noticeably increased when assuming an improved 'thriving and pleasant' road with almost 42% anticipating frequent use and 95% predicting regular or more use. This is a positive indicator for good change.

A key question was what would make most difference in the road with Better Environment and Streetscape a clear preference. Better Safety score highly, fitting in with the many comments received about anti social behaviour and crime. Interestingly, as a second choice, a street market scored well.

Comments were received on this and the following questions which can be read below. There were many interesting comments.

The questions then drilled down into each of the main areas of difference suggested in the survey.

Better Accessibility: Maintaining free on street parking and improving the street design for pedestrians and road users ranked highest.

Better Environment and Streetscape: Improved street cleaning was the clear preference. Surprisingly, given the terrible refuse problem, this did not rank higher (perhaps the 'co-ordination' aspect to the question was not fully understood. Also, Christmas lights ranked poorly despite pre-survey supportive comments having been received over time and two participants commenting in favour.

Better Marketing: Events were the clear preference with little support to digital and other promotion suggestions. This is an interesting call for real life activity over virtual activity.

Better Safety: Improved uniformed presence was the clear preference with crime reduction a close second. All other options ranked much lower.

A Street Market: Food/Drink came out on top followed closely by Flea/Vintage/Antique and then General. Monthly or fortnightly and Saturday or Sunday were the preferences.

Relay the road and pavements

Make pavement easier to navigate

Bays on HCR should be for 30 minutes only, then all paid parking in the car park at the crossroads. Having said that, the way people park on the St John's - London road portion often means driving down this part of the road is tricky, therefore a redesign might be better.
